<p>Declaration of sulphites that are found in their creamer ingredient. The source of the sulphites found within the creamer came from "glucose syrup solids". Does manufacturer need to declare sulphites on their labels since the sulphites were determined to be in the product at levels less than 10 ppm. Comments from Food Labelling and Composition Specialist, Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The "product label" in question where the "creamer" is an ingredient, would need to declare the creamer (1st generation ingredient) and the components of the creamer (2nd generation ingredients). If there is no direct addition of sulfites to the finished product and there are no added sulfites as a component of any of the ingredients of the finished product, and the finished product contains less than 10 ppm sulfites, there is no requirement for declaration of sulfites as per the Canada Food and Drugs Act (FDA) and Regulations (FDR).</li><li>• Sulfites must be declared at any level of use when directly added to a food as a food additive or when indirectly added to a food as components of an ingredient that is not exempted from component declaration.</li><li>• Sulfites added as components of an ingredient exempted from component declaration will have to be declared when the total amount of sulfites contained within the food is 10 ppm or more in the finished product. FDR B.01.010.3(1)(b)(iii) The Food and Drug Regulations (FDR) <a href="http://laws-lois.justice.gc.ca/eng/regulations/C.R.C.,_c._870/index.html">http://laws-lois.justice.gc.ca/eng/regulations/C.R.C.,_c._870/index.html</a></li><li>• While the enhanced food allergen regulations address only added sulfites, any food product that has a list of ingredients and has &gt;10 ppm sulfites, regardless of whether they are added or naturally occurring, would be required to declare sulfites in order to meet the requirement of Food and Drugs Act 5 (1) "No person shall label, package, treat, process, sell or advertise any food in a manner that is false, misleading or deceptive or is likely to create an erroneous impression regarding its character, value, quantity, composition, merit or safety".</li></ul>
